



How to Read Your eBook

Congratulations on your new eBook purchase! This guide will walk you through the simple steps to start reading on your phone, tablet, or computer.

Accessing Your eBook in Various Formats

Your eBook will typically be provided in one of a few common file types. Here is how to open each one:

Kindle (.mobi file)

To open .mobi files on the Kindle app, you have two primary options:

1. **Email Transfer:** Send the .mobi file as an attachment to your Kindle's unique email address. It will then appear under the "Docs" section in your Kindle library.
2. **USB Transfer:** Connect your device to your computer, locate the Kindle folder (or the "Documents" folder on iOS), and copy the .mobi file there. The file should appear in your Kindle app when you open it.

Other eReaders (.ePub file)

EPUB is a standard format that works with most non-Kindle eReaders. You will need an EPUB reader application to open it.

Here are some popular options for handling EPUB files:

Reader	Best For...
Calibre	 The Powerhouse. Managing, converting, and editing libraries.
Adobe Digital Editions	 DRM. Library books and protected retail files.
Google Play Books	 Cloud Sync. Reading the same book across web and mobile.
Apple Books	 Apple Ecosystem. Seamless sync between Mac, iPad, and iPhone.

You can also use web browser extensions like [EPUBReader](#) to open EPUB files directly in browsers such as Chrome or Edge.
